SPSY 532 School Safety and Crisis Preparedness

Content: School Safety and Crisis Preparedness is an intensive, interactive and practice-dominated course that utilizes the evidence-based PREPaRE (Prevent, Reaffirm, Evaluate, Provide and Respond, Examine) curriculum to help school psychologists improve and strengthen their school safety and crisis management plans, respond effectively to emergency situations, and identify appropriate evidence-based intervention strategies. Prerequisites: None.

Attendance policy:

Students are required to watch the 7 recorded lectures as indicated below prior to the synchronous meetings on 6/10 and 6/11 (SPSY 532-01) or 6/17 and 6/18 (SPSY 532-02). Students are required to be present for the entire sessions of the synchronous meetings (breaks will be provided).

Materials for the PREPaRE Workshop 2 will be provided to students, ordered through the Lewis and Clark and provided by the National Association of School Psychologists. During the second week of the semester (5/10-5/14), students need to have downloaded all participant materials. Have them available on your laptop or other mobile device. Please print the following materials: the .ppt slides in handout form, an Action Planning form, and handouts 14, 38, 40, 41.

IMPORTANT: Prior to beginning this course (that is, before you listen to the first recorded video), you need to have registered and downloaded materials from the NASP website and have completed the PRETEST. The results of the PRETEST do not affect your obtaining a certificate of completion nor your grade in this course. At the conclusion of the two synchronous days, you will log back into your online account to complete the POSTTEST and workshop evaluation. Again, these do not affect your grade.

Course objectives:

- •Students will become familiar with the variables of crisis events and the levels of crisis intervention. (NASP Domains: 1, 4, 6)
- •Students will recognize risk factors that predict psychological trauma and identify warning signs that may indicate such trauma. (NASP Domains: 4, 6, 7, 8)
- •Students will learn common crisis reactions and will recognize the differences between common reactions and mental illness (NASP Domains: 4, 6)
- Students will learn the steps in conducting psychological triage following a crisis event. (NASP Domains: 4, 6)
- •Students will identify the levels of crisis interventions appropriate for low to high risk of psychological trauma and the elements of each mental health crisis intervention. (NASP Domains: 4, 6, 7, 8)

Grading:

Students who fully participate in all parts of the course will earn an A. Full credit may only be earned by full participation.
