The Program Evaluation, also known as a Degree Audit, displays the requirements for your specific degree and documents the courses you have used to satisfy each of those requirements. The Program Evaluation is the most useful tool for tracking your progress toward graduation and you should review it frequently. Every student begins with an Undeclared program, which reflects the General Education requirements. Once you declare a major and/or minor those requirements will also be added into the Program Evaluation.

## Major and Minor Requirements

Course Substitutions: Like General Education requirements, Major and Minor requirements are determined by the Catalog year of your program. If you think that a course should be used to satisfy a requirement but is not reflected on your program evaluation, you should contact the Chair of your major. Some courses - such as Topics classes like ENG-333, have to be placed into the requirement manually, as the topic has to be verified. Courses that fall outside of the Major or Minor requirements as defined by the Catalog year of your program can be placed by the Department Chair with a Course Substitution form, available in the Registrar's office.

Disrete Credits in the Major/Minor: Please note that each major must have 28 discrete credits that are unique to that Major. Each Minor must have at least 12 discrete credits unique to that minor (some minors require more).
