

Advanced Program Employer Survey

In the 2018-19 academic year we piloted a newly developed survey to collect quantifiable data on employers' satisfaction of our advanced program completers' preparation.

Questions in the Advanced Program Employer Survey were developed using a mapping to InTASC Standards. For the pilot phase, we are focusing on the four InTASC standards most relevant to preparation of our advanced program completers. Employers are asked to reflect on completers from the last three years when filling out the survey.

As we continue to gather data and a greater sample size is reached, results will be available aggregated on a program level. Initial, mid-year results from our pilot are aggregated for all school-based advanced programs below.

4-point Scale: Strongly Dissatisfied – 1, Dissatisfied, Satisfied, Strongly Satisfied – 4
