### **School Counseling**

*Addendum to Testing Requirements.*

This addendum removes the following testing requirement:

NES: School Counselor Test.

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The following test must be passed in order to be eligible for a recommendation by Lewis & Clark for school counseling licensure in any state. Detailed information regarding the point in the program by which each test must be passed is available in the program handbook.

The required test is: 1. ORELA: Protecting Student and Civil Rights in the Educational Environment Exam† Students may view completed tests, including scores, by logging into their WebAdvisor account.

† Students who hold a current Oregon Basic, Standard, Initial, Continuing, Preliminary, Professional, or Teacher Leader teacher or personnel services license may waive the ORELA: Protecting Student and Civil Rights in the Educational Environment test.

*Addendum to add the master of science in art therapy degree option.*

### **Master of Science in Art Therapy**

Credits: Minimum of 60 semester hours

After admission to the Master of Arts in Art Therapy program, students may choose to seek a Master of Science degree in art therapy. This option includes all the requirements for the Master of Arts in Art Therapy, plus additional coursework and the completion of a thesis. It is often of interest to students planning to pursue a doctoral degree or publish in the field who have demonstrated interest and potential in research. The Master of Science is available after a student:

- first applies and is admitted to the MA program.
- completes at minimum the first semester of the MA program.
- formally applies to the MS program.
- forms of a thesis committee.
- receives approval of the thesis proposal at a proposal meeting.

### **Degree Requirements**

A minimum of 60 semester hours. 54 in the MA degree, plus 6 credits distributed as follows.

Students must meet all regular requirements for a Master in Art Therapy and:

One of the following, with a grade of B or better:

[CPSY 538](#) Advanced Research Methods 3

(Or)

[CPSY 537](#) Qualitative Research Methods 2

And

[CPSY 594](#) Proposal Writing

(students who took CPSY 538 take 1 semester hour of Proposal Writing; students who took CPSY 537 take 2 semester hours of Proposal Writing)

[CPSY 595](#) Master's Thesis Research

(Satisfactory completion of a thesis—a minimum of 2 semester hours and maximum of 9 semester hours is required)
