uncertainty, fear and expressions of hate in the broader community. Students are encouraged to register for this intensive course with a team. This is not required but will make it easier to bring these practices to life in your own setting if you learn to do this work as a team. The restorative justice practices taught in this course focus on the adult community of the school and are appropriate for staff meetings, community meetings, and can be translated into classroom practices. In this intensive three days leaders (and their teams) will participate in restorative justice practices and learn from experience to design and facilitate a variety of restorative processes that will strengthen and continuously restore a sense of justice in their professional community. School leaders are facing unprecedented conditions in which to establish and lead inclusive, supportive and welcoming school communities. This course is for leaders and leadership teams who want new social-justice focused tools to heal the harms of divisive socio-political rhetoric and action.
